COLONEL RANDON L. STORMS

Col. Randon L. Storms is the commander of the Air Force Security Assistance Training Squadron, Joint Base San Antonio-Randolph, Texas. In this role, he guides 240 members across six directorates, which facilitate training for more than 13,000 students annually from 169 countries. The squadron is the executive agent for all Air Force-sponsored international training and education and manages a portfolio valued at \$11.9 billion to build partners' capacity, security and relationships.

Colonel Storms entered the Air Force in January 2002 as a graduate of the Reserve Officer Training Corps program at Brigham Young University where he received a Bachelor of Science in International Law and Diplomacy. As an F-15E Strike Eagle Weapon Systems Officer, he has served in a variety of training, operational, and staff positions including commander of the 48th Operations Support Squadron at Royal Air Force Lakenheath, UK. He is a Master Navigator with more than 1,800 hours in the F-15E and multiple training aircraft. Prior to his current position, Colonel Storms was the Air Force Chief, Strategy, Innovation, and Futures Division, Headquarters Air Education and Training Command.
