Colonel Greg Hignite is the Director of Public Affairs at Air Education and Training Command. He is responsible for public affairs counsel to the commander and headquarters staff, along with providing communication guidance to 25 wings, 11 bases and five geographically separated groups comprising more than 60,000 personnel. The public affairs staff develop communication strategies to promote public understanding and support for the command's missions and activities, as well as those of the Department of the Air Force and Department of Defense.
