



Department of the Air Force Learning Record (DAFLR) Frequently Asked Questions

What is the Department of the Air Force Learning Record (DAFLR)?

DAFLR is a “one stop shop” for learning information available to all Airmen and Guardians. It is an individual digital portfolio consolidating and displaying a comprehensive record of education, training, and experiential accomplishments throughout a learner’s career in one location; a validated record of what an individual knows and can do.

The DAFLR application, hosted in Envision, is available via CAC login to all Total Force (Active Duty, Guard, and Reserve) Airmen, Guardians, and civilians. DAFLR collects learning completion data from multiple authoritative sources (i.e. myVector, myLearning, Military Personnel Data System (MilPDS), Defense Civilian Personnel Data System (DCPDS) (via myBiz), myTraining, VMet and more.

How do I access my DAFLR?

Airmen and Guardians can access their [DAF Learning Record](#) via CAC login in the Envision environment. It is available to all Total Force (Active Duty, Guard, and Reserve) Airmen, Guardians, and civilians.

What is Envision?

The Envision platform is part of the DAF data fabric and was originally stood up to track covid numbers. Envision hosts data from over 165 authoritative sources connected to its environment. Multiple MAJCOMs have utilized its reporting and analysis capabilities to meet mission needs. The DAFLR is the first Envision application supporting every Airmen and Guardian DAF-wide.

Why do we need the DAFLR?

Currently, individuals must access multiple systems (e.g. myTraining, myLearning, MyVector, myBiz/DCPDS, MilPDS, vMET, etc...), to manually consolidate training, education, and experience data which is time consuming. DAFLR provides a single, consolidated record of all learning, experiences, and credentials in one place. DAFLR displays historical learning data that may not be displayed by other system of records due to their display limitation (e.g. SURF).

Where does DAFLR pull data?

DAFLR consolidates personnel data from (MilPDS), Defense Civilian Personnel Data System (DCPDS) (via myBiz), education and training data from myLearning, and experience and self-reported learning information data from MyVector, along with a host of other authoritative sources. Is DAFLR accessible from any device, anywhere?

Due to PII, DAFLR is accessible via CAC only, which will limit its access to government-approved devices.

Is DAFLR replacing the systems I currently use to track my training?

No, the DAFLR is not being developed to replace any authoritative sources, but as an authoritative repository pulling learning information from relevant DAF authoritative sources. Airmen and Guardians will continue to use the existing authoritative sources to input, modify or upload current learning data.

How is DAFLR different from myLearning, MyVector, myTraining?

DAFLR is NOT a Learning Management System (LMS), hosting courses or classes such as myLearning. It is not a Human Resources (HR) system that inputs and manages all personnel data for a DAF employee or a Student Information System (SIS) that manages all information related to a student's journey. The major difference is, DAFLR acts as a single repository dashboard consolidating and displaying Airman and Guardian's completed learning information (i.e. education, training, and experiences) in one location from multiple DAF authoritative sources.

How will the DAFLR benefit commanders and leaders at all levels?

DAFLR empowers DAF leadership with the ability to make data-informed decisions by identifying skills gaps to analyze mission readiness in minutes/hours vs days/weeks to effectively invest in people, training, and education programs, ensuring the right Airmen or Guardian is in the right place at the right time.

As Commander, UTM, Functional Manager, etc., how do I request unit view access in the DAFLR?

Complete PII training and request PII access from the Envision platform by clicking the "Update Access" button on the DAFLR Homepage.

How is DAFLR different than myVector?

MyVector aligns with the Air Force's objective of providing a standardized process for career development and mentoring. It offers the capacity to fully create a career plan. DAFLR integrates and presents the MyVector career development plan and other self-reported learning completion information as a part of its holistic view. The DAFLR holistic view encompasses the individual's past education, training, experiences, credentials and development plans.

Does DAFLR include learning readiness training information?

Yes. The DAFLR includes readiness training information such as Ready Airmen Training.



Does DAFLR include my medical information?

No. DAFLR does not include medical information.

How is the DAFLR different from my Single Unit Retrieval Format (SURF)?

The SURF provides personnel's duty title, duty history, Air Force Specialty Codes, as well as all awards and decorations received, the SURF functions like a printable resume and has limited fields where it does not display a learner's entire career information. The SURF is also only applicable to military personnel. The DAFLR is a total force individual digital portfolio (i.e. Active duty military, Guard, Reserve and civilians) providing a single, consolidated real-time, interactive record of all learning data completion (training, education, experience, credentials) in one place and throughout the career of an Airmen and Guardian. The DAFLR displays historical learning data and other learning data from additional authoritative sources that may not be displayed in the SURF due to its display limitation (e.g. SURF).

Does DAFLR allow you to self-report information?

Currently, the self-report function is available to all learners to upload into their DAFLR. However, the self-report capability is "self-validated" at this time and not considered authoritative, but complimentary information. The self-report function allows learners to fill in the gaps where learning completion is not tracked in an authoritative source.

Can reports be generated in DAFLR?

Yes. DAFLR will provide the ability to generate and download reports.

Is the DAFLR mandatory?

While the DAFLR is not a mandatory requirement at this time, Airmen and Guardian are highly encouraged to utilize its functionality, as it offers a real-time, interactive, streamlined approach to learning data management. DAFLR consolidates all information in a single location and ultimately saves time to for learner's proactive self-development and leadership for force development decisions impacting the mission.

Will the DAFLR be integrated with DoD's joint force initiative, Enterprise Learner Record Repository?

Yes, the DAFLR will be the sole source of consolidated DAF learning data for integration with the DoD's Enterprise Learner Record Repository (ELRR). The DAFLR will employ ELRR-specific data standards ensuring seamless, cross-Service record sharing of joint and inter-service training completion and credential information. The ELRR relies on DAF and sister Services to provide the relevant data necessary to ensure DoD personnel have the skills and credentials required to optimize their career path and development.



Will DAFLR be accessible via myLearning?

Yes. The DAFLR will be accessible via myLearning via a hyperlink. DAFLR will also be linked from the AF Portal, the DAFLR public page, myFSS, Envision banner, myLearning, DAF e-Learning, and MyVector.
